Dear Parents

I am extremely proud of our Sixth Form pupils, who undertake important duties, set an example to the younger pupils and are wonderful ambassadors for the School.

Whilst the majority of Sixth Form pupils are smartly and appropriately dressed, it has been necessary this term to speak to a number of pupils with regard to uniform and appearance. Your son or daughter *may* have been one of those pupils and I would like to refer you to the uniform guidelines found in the Admissions section of the School website, and to reiterate the following.

Boys should be smartly dressed with top buttons done up, tie neatly in place, blazer worn at all times, hair in a neat style and shirt tucked in. Could I ask that all boys return to school after the Christmas holiday in compliance with these regulations and use the holiday to have a hair cut, if necessary.

Girls should wear a smart jacket and tailored skirt no more than 2 inches above the knee. Lycra and bodycon skirts are not acceptable. It has been necessary to speak to some of the girls about the suitability of their skirts and all girls should return to school after the holiday in a skirt which complies with the school guidelines. Those who do not will be asked to change immediately into a school-purchased skirt and the cost will be added to the next term's account.

I look forward to seeing a smart Sixth Form back at School in the New Year.
