### **Cambridge Occupational Analysis (COA) – Careers Brief and Profile**

Before half-term, all Year 10 pupils participated in this analysis and they received their individual reports in June. These were discussed individually with your son's or daughter's tutor. I have asked them to show you the report and discuss it.

**Section A** gives a breakdown in order of the main areas of interest and typical careers associated with them. These are not recommendations, but general areas of career types.

**Section B** gives a breakdown of areas of interest, in descending order of their match with aptitude shown in the test.

**Section C** takes the areas of interest and gives questions to check awareness.

**Section D** gives cautionary notes.

**Section E** matches areas of interest to IB and A Levels offered at PGS and courses at university.

**Section F** gives a breakdown of aptitude in the various areas of the Profile Test.

Included in the pack is a careers investigation folder which allows your son or daughter to investigate up to six career areas from The Careers Directory handed to them with their report, or any other sources. Please give this report careful consideration: the results may confirm or question existing interests and also suggest new areas for research.

### **Work Experience**

Tutors have raised the matter of work experience in the interview. We would expect this normally to be undertaken between the end of June 2011 and the start of the Lower Sixth year in the following September, but if there are opportunities to gain experience before that date then please make use of them. It is a good idea to begin the process of looking for a placement for the summer of 2011 as soon as possible. You may be able to find work experience by contacting local companies or asking
