Sixth Form

TROUSER SUIT UNIFORM

School branded blazer with black trousers or a two or three piece black matching suit

Trousers must be full length, tailored and of classic fit. No leggings, culottes, ankle-length / cropped trousers, skinny fit or jeans.

Sixth Form or School issued tie
White long sleeved shirt - short sleeve in Summer Term

Plain black v-neck pullover with no motif (optional)

SKIRT SUIT UNIFORM

A black matching suit two or three piece with a tailored skirt.

The skirt must be tailored and appropriate in length and a design for a formal interview (not stretch material / tube design). Further advice can be obtained from the Head of Sixth Form.

Sixth Form or school issued tie.
White long sleeved shirt - short sleeve in Summer Term

Plain black v-neck pullover with no motif (optional)



SPORT

Games Representative

When representing the school pupils are expected to wear the appropriate representative team kit.

In addition pupils will require:

PGS Sport Tracksuit Trousers or leggings (unbranded/plain black sports leggings). These should be worn at all times if in sports kit around school.

Mouthguard: compulsory for Rugby or Hockey.

Shin pads required when playing Hockey.

Boots with moulded or screw-in kite marked safety studs for Rugby players only

Games Non-Representative

PGS polo shirt (red or white, available in the Uniform Shop)

PGS Sport Tracksuit Trousers or leggings (unbranded/plain black sports leggings). These should be worn at all times if in sports kit around school.

Black branded PGS Shorts or skort

Sport trainers or Astro shoes

Shin pads (Football)

Optional:

Black waterproof PGS Sport Jacket

PGS Sport hoodie

Black sports leggings may be worn under a skort or shorts whilst playing sport

Sixth Form

Guidance and expectations applicable to both uniforms:

To and From School

- Pupils are expected to wear their uniform correctly at all times, including on the journey to and from school, to fixtures and on school visits. Casual jumpers should not be worn to and from school but school hoodies can be worn under the blazer in winter months and removed upon arrival in school.
- Pupils should travel to school in full PGS Sport kit on days where they have PE, Games and co-curricular sport. In order to ensure safety in practical lessons, such as DT and Science, pupils should have a full-length option with them at all times.

Jewellery

- All jewellery should be non-ostentatious in style. Up to two earrings in each ear are permissible and they should be discreet. Pupils may wear jewellery appropriate for a formal interview. Facial piercings are not permitted.

Hair

- Hair should be neat, well groomed, off the face and be non-ostentatious in style. Long hair should be tied back for practical lessons and short hair should not be shorter than that achieved by a No3 cut. Hair must be of natural colour and if dyed of natural tones. Miscellaneous hair adornments are not allowed except for grips used to keep hair tied back. Pupils should be clean shaven.

Shoes / Tights / Socks

- All shoes must be smart in appearance and of polished black leather (no plimsolls, black sports shoes, boots or heels greater than two inches)
- Plain black ankle socks (no pattern) or plain black or natural tights are allowed, no patterns or pictures.

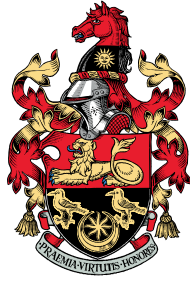


Coats / Gloves / Scarves / Hats

- Coats must be of a single dark colour and a simple design, no leather or suede. School scarves or plain black scarves may be worn in cold weather to and from school. School beanie hats or plain black hats may also be worn to and from school. Coats, hats and scarves may be worn to and from school, but not in school during the school day.

Make-Up

- Make-up should be discreet. Foundation, mascara (black or brown), neutral coloured lip gloss and nail varnish consistent with a professional style is permitted.



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Pupils and parents should consult the uniform requirements on the school website/school portal for details on the skirt and trouser uniform.

If in any doubt about the suitability of any items of clothing please consult with the Head of Sixth Form or your Head of Year before making a purchase.

Persistent and knowing breaches of the Code will result in sanctions being applied and could result in the individual being sent home to change.

Additional Information

Bags should be adequate for carrying kit and books without damage. Most pupils use sports bags or back packs, but these should not be large expedition-style rucksacks.

Large kit bags should be stowed in lockers during the day.

Requests for variation in school uniform

The Portsmouth Grammar School is a Christian non-denominational school that welcomes pupils of all faiths and none. Parents should be aware that all pupils at The Portsmouth Grammar School are required to wear a uniform.

The Head will consider written requests from parents for variations in the uniform on religious or medical grounds that are consistent with the school's ethos and its policy on health and safety. The Head may take expert advice, and arrange to meet with the parents to discuss the implications of such a request.
